

PROGRAMS WITH A PURPOSE

As part of the Greater Joliet Area YMCA's Teen Achievers program, local high school students had the opportunity to participate in several college tours over spring break.

The college tours brought together more than 45 students from area high schools served by the Teen Achievers program, including Joliet West, Joliet Central, Plainfield Central, Plainfield East, Plainfield South, Minooka, and Morris.

Tours were split over three days, allowing students to visit six institutions across Illinois and Wisconsin. Students visited Aurora University, Northern Illinois University, Marquette University, University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Illinois State University, and Illinois Wesleyan University.

The Y's Teen Achievers program provides essential support for high school students as they set and achieve educational, professional, and personal goals. The variety of colleges and universities visited on these tours helped students broaden their understanding of options for their post-secondary education.

DEVELOPING FUTURE LEADERS

The Greater Joliet Area YMCA's summer volunteer program helps young adults gain meaningful work experience while providing extra care to our summer campers. We are proud to say that during the 2022 Summer Camp season, our incredible group of 25 volunteers provided more than 1,600 hours of assistance across our YMCA's 10 campsites in Will and Grundy Counties.

"Our summer camp volunteer program has been incredibly successful, and we want to thank our staff team for providing ongoing support to our summer volunteers," said Volunteer and Community Engagement Director Dori Fugate. "By seamlessly integrating our volunteers into summer camp programs, teens in our community were given opportunities to build new skills, take on new challenges, make new friends and just have fun, all of which are key as we develop our future leaders."

STRONG SWIMMERS, CONFIDENT KIDS

As America's most trusted swim instructor, the YMCA has been teaching kids how to swim for more than 100 years. In addition to providing free swim lessons to summer day campers, the YMCA's Safety Around Water program has partnered with local schools and community organizations to help ensure children in our community have the opportunity to develop this essential life skill.

In 2022, the Y provided more than 5,000 free swim lessons to students from Troy School District 30C and Fairmont School District 89, children from the Harvey Brooks Foundation and iLEAD Youth Center, and summer day campers at the Galowich Family YMCA and Messiah Lutheran Church.

EMBRACING A HEALTHY LIFESTYLE

At the Y, we know that having a strong support system can make a big difference when you are trying to maintain a healthy lifestyle. For the husband and wife team of Bill Turton and Maraline Mattke, joint personal training sessions at the **Galowich Family YMCA** have proven to be a crucial part of their health and wellness journeys.



Bill, a Y member for more than 45 years, says personal training has helped him navigate the challenges of Parkinson's disease. While Maraline, who joined the Y shortly after the couple got married in 2003, is seeing the benefits of personal training following multiple knee replacement surgeries and the removal of a brain tumor.

"The staff at the Y has been nothing but tremendous during my time here. Whether it's full-time staff, lifeguards, or custodians, everyone goes out of their way to be helpful," Bill said.

HEALTHY COMMUNITIES START HERE

In July 2022, the **C.W. Avery Family YMCA** and Edward-Elmhurst Health announced the formation of a new partnership to enhance the health and wellness of C.W. Avery Family YMCA members and residents living in Plainfield and the surrounding communities.

The combined vision and resources of Edward-Elmhurst Health and the C.W. Avery Family YMCA now offer enhanced health and wellness programming to the community, including:

- An on-site physical therapy clinic run by Edward-Elmhurst Health
- Opportunities for health education and screenings
- Shared wellness, nutrition, weight management, and senior wellness offerings
- Expanded healthcare offerings for the Plainfield area

"We are very excited to welcome Edward-Elmhurst Health to the C.W. Avery Family YMCA," said Greater Joliet Area YMCA President and CEO Katy Leclair.

"Through this unique collaboration, we will work together to introduce innovative and impactful health and wellness initiatives for residents of all ages living in Plainfield and the surrounding areas."

For **Morris Community YMCA** member George Miller, completing a 64 kilometer bike race was a rewarding experience made possible, in part, by exercising at the Y.

Miller competed in the Rough Road 100 Spring Classic Gravel Race in April, finishing with a time of four hours, six minutes. He was one of just three competitors over the age of 70 to complete the course.

"I had been training since the start of the year," George said. "I was alternating between personal training, spin classes, and my own cycle training."

George had been a Y member in the past and was inspired to join again after retiring.

"I'm usually in here four days a week. I just love the companionship. It's really great to be around people," George said.




